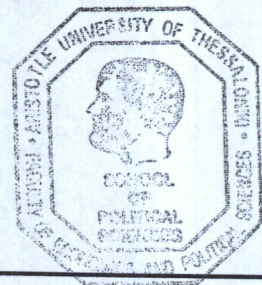

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- 3. INFORMATION ON THE LEVEL OF THE QUALIFICATION
  - 3.1 Level of qualification: 1st Cycle
  - 3.2 Official length of programme:  
 8 SEMESTERS, 240 ECTS.  
 A full academic year is equivalent to 60 ECTS units and each semester to 30 ECTS (European Credit Transfer System) (1 ECTS= 25-30 student work load hours). Compliance with the ECTS (European Credit Transfer and Accumulation System) regulations started in 2007, when the Greek Legislation was harmonized with the relevant European one (Ministerial Decision no Φ5/89656/β3, art. 1-3, Hellenic Government Gazette no 1466/2007/B). Each course is credited with a number of ECTS(>=2) according to the student's workload (contact hours, laboratory work, examination etc) and accumulation of credits (ECTS) is accomplished after successful completion of course
  - 3.3 Access requirement(s):  
 Upper secondary degree. National level examination.

Full-time.

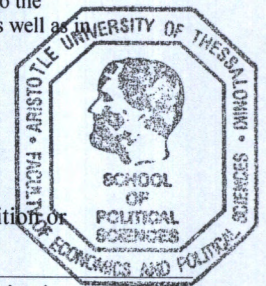
**4.2 Programme requirements:**

In order to receive the degree of the School of Political Sciences students are obliged to follow and pass the examinations of the required number of courses from the undergraduate studies program (core courses, elective courses, exchange). Marking of each course can be based on written or oral examinations, on the submission of essays or on a combination of the aforementioned methods.

Upon graduating from the undergraduate program of the School of Political Sciences, graduates are equipped with:

- The necessary knowledge (theoretical, conceptual and analytical) allowing them to map and understand political phenomena: political institutions, processes and antagonisms, as they unfold at the local, national and international levels.
- The required tools and methods, originating from various (quantitative and qualitative) research traditions in political science and related disciplines, permitting them to analyse relations between collective and individual subjects within the framework of organized society.
- The intellectual/critical skills allowing them to describe and interpret identities, relationships, ideologies and policies, and to support decision-making processes in a democratic public sphere.
- The practical skills necessary for the successful collection and evaluation of evidence, the processing and synthesis of information from a variety of sources (conventional and electronic), the scientific questioning and development of arguments in written and oral discourse, the tackling of multiple challenges in a comprehensive way, the efficient completion of individual and group assignments, as well as for participating in the design and implementation of research and professional projects with a feeling of social, democratic and ethical responsibility.

In terms of career opportunities available, the aforementioned skills and competences confer on the graduates of the School of Political Sciences the ability to perform a variety of professional duties in the public sector (from local councils and the civil service to the educational sector and the diplomatic service, the private sector (from the media to consulting and advertizing enterprises) as well as Non Governmental Organizations and International and Regional Organizations.

Courses denoted with an asterisk (\*) are optional extras and therefore are not required for the Degree. Before the award of the Degree the student decides and declares formally which of the courses will not be taken into account (section 5, Ministerial Decision no Φ14.1/B3/2166, Hellenic Government Gazette no 308/87). The degree is awarded according to the required minimum local credit units (150.0) and the student may be examined in two more optional courses (art. 60, Ministerial Decision no Φ1.231/B1/425, Hellenic Government Gazette no 1099/2000/B ).

ECTS grading (A=10%, B=25%, C=30%, D=25%, E=10%) is based on a sample of a minimum of 100 students. If the sample is not sufficient then nothing is noted (according to the Ministerial Decision no Φ.5/89656/B3, art. 4, Hellenic Government Gazette no 1466/2007/B). The ECTS grading system is based on the Annex 3 of the ECTS Guide, 2009, and on Crocker, L., & Algina, J. (1986). Introduction to classical and modern test theory. New York: Harcourt Brace Jovanovich College Publishers.

Dissertations or/and Internship projects as well are considered as individual projects and they are not graded based on a previous sample. The same stands for the Erasmus courses for which we accept the grading of the receiving institution and we convert it to the local grade accordingly.

#### 4.4 Grading scheme, and if available, grade distribution guidance :

A scale of 1 to 10 applies to the marks of each subject in the Hellenic Higher Education.

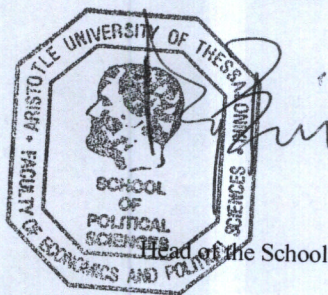

## 8. INFORMATION ON THE NATIONAL HIGHER EDUCATION SYSTEM

Pursuant to the Constitution (article 16, paragraph 5), Greek Tertiary Education is public and gratis. Furthermore, according to the legal framework, it is divided into:

- (a) the University sector (A.E.I.): Universities, Technical Universities, Fine Arts School, etc., and
- (b) the Technological sector (T.E.I.): Technological Education Institutions and the School of Pedagogic and Technological Education.

Part of the University sector is also, since 1998, the Greek Open University, which provides open and distance -undergraduate and postgraduate- education and training.

There are also state post-secondary non-tertiary Institutions offering vocationally oriented courses of shorter duration (2 to 3 years), which operate under the authority of other Ministries.

All graduates of secondary education (Geniko and Epagelmatiko Lykeio) can be admitted to Higher Education Institutions, depending on the general score obtained in national examinations that take place at the end of the final year of Lyceum. The admission system is based on the number of available places (numerus clausus), the candidates' performance, and the candidates' ranked preferences of Schools. Admission to particular schools may also require a special examination (eg drawing for Architecture, etc.).

Study programmes in Higher Education Institutions last from four to six years, depending on the subject area. Students who successfully complete their studies are awarded a Ptychio / Diploma, which permits employment or further studies at post-graduate level leading to a Metaptychiako Diploma Eidikefsis (2<sup>nd</sup> cycle) - equivalent to the Master's degree- and to the doctorate degree (3<sup>d</sup> cycle), Didaktoriko Diploma.

Legislation on quality assurance in Higher Education, the Credit Transfer and Accumulation System (ECTS) and the Diploma Supplement defines the framework and the criteria for the evaluation of Higher Education Institutions, and for the certification of programmes of studies. These measures aim, among others, at promoting student mobility and contributing to the creation of the European Higher Education Area.
