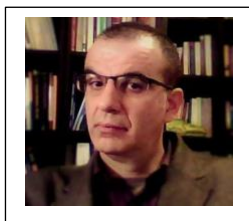

Speakers' Short Bios

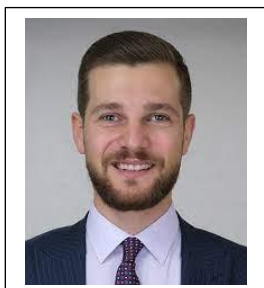
George Andreou is Assistant Professor at the School of Political Sciences, Aristotle University of Thessaloniki.



He studied political science and international relations at the University of Athens and at the College of Europe (Bruges, Belgium) and received his PhD in political science and public administration from the University of Athens (2001). He has worked at the Department of Political Science and Public Administration of the University of Athens, the Department of Political Science of the University of Crete and the Department of Political Science and International Relations at the University of the Peloponnese. His research interests include

policies of the European Union and cohesion policy in particular, the Europeanisation of public policies in the EU and the relations between Greece and the EU.

Agon BATUSHA was born in Kukes on 11 February 1993. In 2015 he completed his studies in European Integration. He continued his postgraduate studies in Political Science at the University of Pristina, Hasan Pristina. He is part of the Friedrich Ebert Stiftung Political School network. He participated in the Balkan FES training for "Promising Politicians".



From 2010 to 2011 he was chairman of the students of the municipality of Kukes. From 2011 to 2013 he was hired as project coordinator at the NGO Kosovar Youth Council (KYC) in Pristina, through which he coordinated projects with international organisations such as the World Bank, Save the Children, UNICEF. He has also been an associate of many national and local organisations in promoting and developing youth and environmental policies. In the 2013 local elections, he

was elected member of the Assembly of the municipality of Kumanovo by the ranks of the Vetevendosje Movement. In 2017 he was re-elected as a member of the Assembly and held office, chief of the LVV Kuvendivide Group in Kukes. In 2018 he was elected Chair of the Movement Centre in Kumanovo.

In the parliamentary elections of 2019, he was elected as an MP from the ranks of the VETEVENDOSJE! Movement (LVV). As a member of the VIth Legislature of the Assembly of the Republic, he is a member of the Committee on European Integration and chairman of the Non-Formal Group of Young Deputies of the Assembly of Kosovo.

Ilir MELO is Director of the Department for the Region and Neighbouring Countries, Albanian Ministry for Europe and Foreign Affairs. Born in 1963, Ilir Melo is a member of Foreign Service with the rank of the Minister Plenipotentiary. Prior to this assignment he served as the Ambassador of Albania to Croatia and as non-resident Ambassador to Bosnia and Herzegovina and during this time he was the Albanian representative to RACVIAC, Zagreb.



Among other assignments he held senior posts as the Director General for International Organisation, the Chief of the Cabinet of the Deputy Prime minister and the Minister for Foreign Affairs and Chargé d'Affaires, a.i. at Albanian Mission in UN as well as Director for the America,



Asia and Africa and Director at the Department of Europe. Mr. Melo has graduated from the Diplomatic Academy in Vienna (1993-1994). He was awarded the Croatian Medal of The Order of Duke Branimir.

Pedja MITROVIC is the Secretary-General of the Freedom and Justice Party, the largest opposition party in Serbia. He is an economist and public administration expert graduating from the Queen Mary University of London. Since 2014, he has been contracted by the EU, the World Bank, and the UNDP to support European integration reforms in the country, primarily in the area of public administration shake-up, including policy planning systems, government action-planning, service delivery, and e-government development.



Dragan TILEV (North Macedonia), State Counselor for European Affairs and member of the Cabinet of the Deputy Prime Minister for EU Affairs, with over 37 years professional experience, working as civil servant for different Government institutions.



During the last 27 years, since 1996, he is directly involved in all major activities related to the integration of the country into the European Union, focusing on coordination of State Policies related to EU integration process and preparations for Accession negotiations, successfully managing and supporting implementation of complex and comprehensive processes and projects. Back in 2004, he was the first Co-chairperson of the EU-North Macedonia Stabilization and Association Committee. From 2010 to 2014, he was placed in Brussels, as Minister Counselor in the Mission to the EU, coordinating national experts and covering topics that include EU

Affairs, Enlargement policy, Public Administration Reform and EU funds. Apart from working for Macedonian Government, on regional level he has provided technical assistance and practical advice on EU integration process to the Governments of Montenegro, Albania, Kosovo, B&H, Serbia and Ukraine.

He is author, co-author and coordinator of numerous publications and articles in local and international newspapers, TV debates and scientific magazines, with his comments on different EU affairs subjects. In addition, during his long professional carrier, he was active in informal think-thank groups and editorial boards.
