

- December 2017 European Council Conclusions
- "Education and culture are key to building inclusive and cohesive societies, and to sustaining our competitiveness."
- Stepping up mobility and exchanges, including through a substantially strengthened, inclusive and extended Erasmus+ programme
- Encouraging the emergence by 2024 of son twenty 'European Universities







Key Elements of European Universities by 2025


- Deep level of inter university cooperation

- Made by and for students, academics, researchers and staff
- Involving all types of higher education institutions with broad geographical scope
- Structural, Systemic and Sustainable impact



Easy recognition


- Will be ensured throughout the network




Teaching & Learning



- Collaborative teaching & learning (e.g. seminars, summer schools, excursions...), joint training of instructors, bottom-up student activities
- Curricular (ECTS-based) and extra- / non-curricular formats (badges)
- Bi- and multilateral + digital and blended and F2F collaborations across partners and WPs and between instructors and students
- Based in 2 Study Tracks + Track Core → "Track design in collaboration with students"



Study Tracks and Track Core



Knowledge & Power



Curriculum concept

Requirements for Track completion

- Min. 30 or 24 ECTS credit points and 6 badges (recognition of non-accredited learning)
- Min. 18 ECTS credit points in one of the EPICUR Study Tracks
- Min. 6 ECTS credit points in the Track Core
- Remaining requirements from the Track or the Core (6 ECTS credit points) or via 6 badges
- Min. of 12 ECTS credit points must be gained outside the students' home university

Maxima (Freiburg B.A. LAS student, Major Governance) – a possible EPICUR track student

- French courses in Freiburg, integrated in the LAS program and in collaboration with WP2
- EPICUR / WP3 digital course on Environmental Governance hosted at AUTh
- 2 courses at Sciences Po Strasbourg via EPICUR
- WP5-organized internship at the European Parliament
- WP3 course on EU Identity Politics

A European University in Practice (2): EPICUR Research Internships

Introduction

- Within EPICUR a programme for research internships on the Bachelor and Master level will be created
- Students will be enabled to gain work-based experience in three areas:
 - Research institutes (internal and external to the universities)
 - Private enterprises (start-ups, major companies, etc.)
 - Civil society organisations
- Research internships last approximately from two to six months
- We aim at designing a programme, which enables students to visit a region of the eight EPICUR partner universities for an internship (physical mobility).

Objectives

The programme for research internships within EPICUR aims at:

- Contributing to the employability of the graduates through hands-on experience
- Deepening their knowledge through applying the theoretical background from their studies in a concrete working environment
- Enhancing their intercultural competences and their proficiency in a foreign language through a stay abroad
- Connecting the regions of the eight EPICUR partner universities through physical mobility of the students



Framework of the programme

We aim at developing a programme which:

- Provides assistance in finding a suitable placement, e.g. in the European institutions based in Strasbourg
- Comprises guidance on, how to apply for a scholarship
- > Creates the **framework for voluntary as well as credit-bearing internships** (with the approval from the home university)

What is Service Learning?





Service Learning at universities

A teaching-learning format consisting of three components:

- 1.) Academic learning
- 2.) Social engagement
- 3.) Reflection





Reflection is understood as the link between practical experience ("service") and "learning" as the understanding and internalisation of what has been learned. Only through reflection, i.e. the thoughtful processing of one's own experience of action, does the process of action become an educational experience (Sliwka 2009:85).

Intercultural Service Learning – Main learning aims for students

Fostering skills, awareness, knowledge and commitment:

- Development of personal competencies, social and professional skills
- Strengthening of metacognitive skills through reflexive thinking (Skliwa 2009)
- General political knowledge and awareness for effective citizenship in a democratic system

Background

Multilingualism, language governance and the sustainability of language (study) programmes are all subjected to heated debates

Language governance subject to heated debates in European Countries

Viability and **sustainability** of Modern Language Programmes challenged

Need for pledging **commitment** to multilingualism and model language policy





Focus & Moonshots Multilingualism EPICUR

- 1) multilingualism and study programmes focusing on European language education
- 2) setting up a EPICUR European model language policy with a focus on diversity and inclusiveness
- Focus
- The role language has to play in a Europe of the future, while taking into account linguistic diversity and accessibility to HEI for all Europeans Consolidating linguistic diversity in Europe
- Ultimate Goal
- EPICUR as **preferred supplier** on **multilingualism** in higher education helping to fulfill the EC ambitions that future generations of Europeans will speak at least two languages in addition to their native language
- **Model Language Policy** for European HEIs ensuring inclusive accessibility to university education removing language barriers
- Middle long term goal
- Creating a joint vision and approach concerning multilingualism and language training in an academic context for EPICUR



Key activities

- 1) EPICUR European model language policy
- 2) Consolidating multilingualism via language teaching and offers
